Dates and Facts

Forster Education Act laid down that schools should be provided for all children.

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2	1880	School was made compulsory for 5 to 10 year olds. However, school was not
		free, except for the poorest children, until 1891.

- ³ 1883 Overton Road School built.
 - Children were required to go to school until they were 12.
- ⁵ 1950s Overton Road School renamed Merrydale.
- 6 1972 School leaving age raised to 16.
- ⁷ 1986 Corporal punishment (e.g. caning) was banned
