



## Top 5 Tudor Facts

- 1 There were six Tudor monarchs who ruled England from 1485 to 1603.
- 2 Tudor England had 2 of the strongest monarchs ever to sit on the English throne: Henry VIII & his daughter Elizabeth I.
- 3 The Tudor rose was created when Henry VII brought an end to the Wars of the Roses. He joined the White Rose of York with the Red Rose of Lancaster to create the Tudor Rose.
- 4 Religion was very important in Tudor times. Everyone had to go to church. If you didn't attend the same church as the monarch you might get arrested, thrown into the Tower of London, or even executed.
- 5 Henry VIII broke away from the Catholic church and created the Protestant Church of England so that he could divorce his first wife. He went on to have six wives, beheading two of them.

Reformation	The act of changing (reforming) something. In this case the reformation of the church to remove the Pope's control.
